

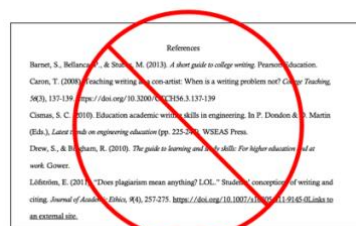
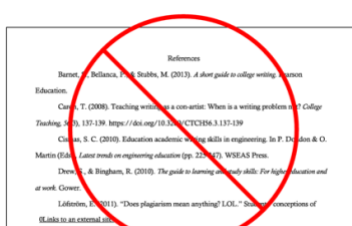
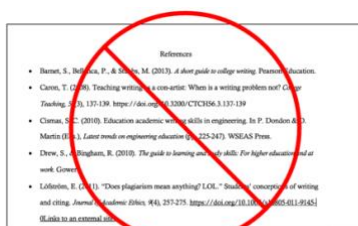
MLA Documentation: Works Cited page

In MLA documentation, the bibliography that lists all the sources referred to in the piece of writing is called Works Cited page. (*In APA documentation, this is called "References."*)

Each entry on a Works Cited page is specifically formatted based on what type of source it is and how many authors there are.

How is a Works Cited page formatted?

- The Works Cited page is the **last page** of the essay.
- It starts at the **top of a new page** (insert a page break after the last paragraph).
- It is **double-spaced** (like the rest of the essay), with no extra space between entries.
- **"Works Cited"** is **centered** at the top.
- Entries are listed **alphabetically** by the first name/word.
- Each entry is formatted as a **HANGING INDENT** (first line flush left, all other lines indented). **NO bullets or numbers** should be used. **Avoid these common formatting errors:**
