# **MLA Documentation: Editing checklist**

To be used in conjunction with a handbook or reliable online style guide. Recommended handbooks & online guides: Troyka & Hesse, Quick Access; Hacker, A Writer's Reference; Scribbr MLA style guide (https://www.scribbr.com/category/mla/); Purdue OWL: http://owl.english.purdue.edu/owl

#### Works Cited page

- \_\_\_\_ The Works Cited page starts at the top of a new page
- \_\_\_\_ The same font style and size is used as was used in the paper
- \_\_\_\_ The title (Works Cited) is centered on the first line
- \_\_\_\_ The Works Cited page is double-spaced, with no extra space between lines
- \_\_\_\_ Entries are arranged in alphabetical order
- \_\_\_\_ Entries are formatted as hanging indents
- \_\_\_\_ No source appears on the Works Cited page that is not cited in the paper
- \_\_\_\_ All sources cited in the paper appear on the Works Cited page
- \_\_\_\_\_ Authors' names are spelled the same on the Works Cited page as they are in text
- \_\_\_\_ All entries are formatted according to a handbook or reliable online guide (see suggested resources at the top of this Guide)
- \_\_\_\_ online article sources: include doi # (if no doi #, use a permalink without the https:// prefix)
- Authors' names (check handbook):
  - \_\_\_\_ one author

### \_\_\_\_\_ two authors

- \_\_\_\_ three or more authors
- \_\_\_\_ corporate or group author
- \_\_\_\_ more than one source by the same author
- Title *formats* (see SVCWC Writing Guide "MLA: Title formats," or check a handbook):
  - \_\_\_\_ article titles
  - \_\_\_\_ *book* titles
  - \_\_\_\_ journal titles

#### In-text & narrative citations

- \_\_\_\_ Every use of source material is fully cited
- Each citation includes a reference to the source, in narrative form (attribution) or in a parenthetical citation

Authors' names (check handbook):

- \_\_\_\_ one author
- \_\_\_\_ two authors
- \_\_\_\_ three or more authors
- \_\_\_\_ corporate or group author
- \_\_\_\_ more than one source by the same author
- Sources are spelled the same as they are on the Works Cited page
- Each citation includes the page number(s). If no page numbers, use paragraph numbers (par. or pars.) only if paragraphs are numbered in the text.
- In-text citation: Include author(s) name(s) and page number. Do NOT separate with a comma (Hyde 235).
- \_\_\_\_ Narrative citation: Author(s) name(s) are part of the sentence; page number in parentheses at the end of the cited material, e.g., Hyde explains..... (235).
- In narrative citations, sources are introduced the first time by full name/s (and with an identifier, if appropriate), e.g., Nathan Hyde explains ... (235). All subsequent reference to sources in attribution use the last name/s only, e.g., Hyde goes on to say.... (236).

## SVCWC Writing Guide: MLA 8<sup>th</sup> Editing checklist con't.

- \_\_\_\_ Running attribution/acknowledgement is used to cite ongoing use from the same source (see SVCWC Writing Guide, "Running attribution/acknowledgement")
- \_\_\_\_ Verbs used in narrative citations (attribution) are in present tense, e.g., Hyde finds...
- \_\_\_\_ Quotations are few and effective
